





There is no charge for dropping off stray animals at the shelter.


The mornings are dark when the upper grades are walking to the bus stops. Please be careful and watch for kids.

Per Fish and Wildlife Dept. ONLY Catch and Release fishing is allowed on the Nisqually River!!




ATTENTION DOG OWNERS:


Speed limit is 20 MPH Please slow down!

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, smart digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.







Food Bank Policies

This is a reminder that July 1, 2013, marks the New Year for the food bank. Food bank clients will need to complete new forms for the first day of the new food bank year.

You will need to bring a picture I.D. for you and all of the adults in the household 18 years and older, plus I.D. showing that you and the people in your household live inside the borders of the Yelm or Rainier School district, or live on the Nisqually Tribal Reservation. Also, bring I.D. for each child in your household under the age of 18 years.

Food bank clients will receive the following services throughout the year:

- 1. Commodities: USDA commodities will be given out on the first Thursday of the month. People who want USDA commodities need to come on that day, from 1:00-4:00, in order to obtain USDA commodities. USDA commodities will only be available on that day, and they will be given out until they are gone. We will post a note if there are any months where there are no commodities available.
- 2. Food Bank: Food bank clients may come once a month on any of the remaining Thursdays, beginning the second Thursday of the month, to pick up food. Food bank clients will receive one bag of food plus other food that we have, as in the past.
- 3. Holiday Foods: In addition to the above, food bank clients can receive a Thanksgiving and/or Christmas food basket. There is no special sign—up needed to obtain holiday foods.
- 4. Adopt-a-Family: Families with children younger than 13 may sign up for holiday gifts. Please watch for the signs and sign up early in order to coordinate your family being adopted.

Food Bank Policies:

- 1. People should get in line sometime before the food bank opens, preferably shortly before so that parking is not negatively impacted.
- 2. People should assemble peacefully. People who take cuts or who are rude to others will be asked to leave.
- 3. People who cannot stand may bring a chair as long as it does not block the work of the staff.
- 4. People may not set things down to "save a place" and then leave them unattended.
- People who disturb the peace or who yell at the staff or volunteers will be asked once to calm
 down and then will be invited to leave. People who continue to engage in disruptive behavior will
 be removed from the property.
- 6. There is no smoking allowed on agency premise.

Grievance Procedure:

Food bank clients who feel they have a grievance with the agency's policies, staff, or volunteers may address their grievances through a formal grievance procedure. Please ask for a copy of the grievance procedure or feel free to examine one that is posted in many places throughout the agency.
