



Thank you to all that donated Halloween Candy and the those that showed up to participate in the Halloween Festival. The staff filled five (5) buckets of bagged candy.





Yellow Squash and Stuffing Casserole Ready In: 45min Serves: 6-8 people

Ingredients

2 lbs. yellow squash. chopped

1 (10 3/4 oz) can cream of mushroom soup

1 cup sour cream

2 1/4 cups dry Pepperidge Farm Herb Stuffing

1/2 cup onion, chopped

1/2 cup butter, melted

2 Tbsp. butter

1/2 tsp salt

1/8 tsp pepper

2 cups shredded cheddar cheese

Directions

- 1. Cook squash and onion together in the two tablespoons of butter until the vegetables are soft.
- 2. Drain well.
- 3. Mix soup, sour cream, salt and pepper.
- 4. Combine half of the herb stuffing and the 2 cups of cheese with the squash mixture and spread into a greased casserole dish.
- 5. Mix remaining herb stuffing with the stick of melted butter and scatter over the top of the casserole.
- 6. Bake in a 350 degree oven for 30 minutes, until golden brown.



Sat & Sun Hours: 11am-7:30pm



Let's remember to drive slow and watch for children walking and waiting at bus stops.



- (9) Fail to stop for school buses when the "STOP" sign is out and the red lights on the school bus are flashing: \$300-eash offense
- (12) Parking vehicles in The Pines right-of-way in a manner that obstructs traffic, the mail carrier, or emergency equipment; or for any period exceeding six (6) hours. Parking on The Pines right-of-way is permitted in the residence's DRIVEWAY only. The vehicle must be two feet or more away from the asphalt.






Carry a flashlight, head lamp or wear bright colored clothes so you can be seen easier during the twilight and evening hours.



Bicycle riders— please make sure your reflectors work or you have a light so you are more visible.






Car Owners- Check your front headlights, rear taillights and brake lights to make sure that they are in working condition.

PUGET SOUND ENERGY Call 811 Before You Dig

Fall has arrived and you may still have plans to start construction and landscaping projects. Your friends at Puget Sound Energy want to remind you about the importance of calling 811 at least two business days prior to any digging. It is the law, and utility-owned lines are located for free.

Whether you are planning to use your employees or hire a contractor, start digging means calling 811 before each job. Outline your dig area in white paint so that the utilities will know where to mark. Even homeowners digging on their on property must call, if digging deeper than 12 inches.

Don't take a chance. Call 811 before you dig, then dig by hand within 2 feet of the markings.


